This week, Lamoille North teachers and staff engaged in numerous activities on our first Early Release Day, strategically designed to offer our students best practices in academics, social emotional well-being and engagement. Specifically, at our elementary schools, some activities included: Faculty review of parent-teacher conference expectations for a unified look at each learner; curriculum, instruction and assessment; a book study session on Social Emotional Leadership; training in the development of literacy skills in grades one through three; training in data management and creation of report cards that will be more accessible to families and more descriptive of learning; training in Fountas & Pinnell and Fundations for literacy; and, work with a consultant around developing strategies to help children and youth attain a regulated state so that they can access learning.

At the secondary level, the afternoon was spent revisiting curriculum alignment and delving more deeply into restorative practices. Each of these activities aligns nicely with our goals to achieve academic rigor, wellbeing and meaningful engagement of all of our students.

In community news, our partners at the local Department of Health office in Morrisville remind us that cold and flu season is upon us. Several of our nurses have let us know they are seeing an uptick in respiratory illness and would like to remind students and staff to please stay home when sick. Lastly, and as communicated in my last email, we are interested in community input and want to hear from all of our stakeholders. Today is the last day to submit interest in participating in a
